HERO(INE) DEFINED:

- 1. a man/woman of distinguished courage or ability, admired for his/her brave deeds and noble qualities.
- 2. a person who, in the opinion of others, has heroic qualities or has performed a heroic act and is regarded as a model or ideal
- 3. the principal male/female character in a story, play, film, etc.

late 14c., "man of superhuman strength or courage," from L. heros "hero," from Gk. heros "demi-god" (a variant singular of which was heroe), originally "defender, protector," from PIE base *ser- "to watch over, protect" (cf. L. servare "to save, deliver, preserve, protect").
