- There is some degree of choice within these required courses.

 - 48 required credits
 - 28 elective credits
 - 4 graduation transitions credits

GRADUATION TRANSITIONS	
Students must earn 4 credits for Graduation Transitions.	4 credits
OVERALL TOTAL	80 credits**
<p>* See pages 5-6 for eligible courses.</p> <p>** Of the 80 credits for graduation, at least 16 must be at the Grade 12 level, including a Grade 12 Language Arts course. Others may be required courses or elective credits.</p>
